Canceling Mail-In Ballot Applications in Texas

If a voter needs to cancel their Mail-in Ballot Application, they have the following options:

- **By Mail:** Make a written request for cancellation of a mail-in ballot, and return all mail-in ballot application materials (including their ballot if they've already received it) by mail to their county's early voting clerk's office and make sure it is received no later than 3 days before Election Day
- In-Person: a voter can return all of their mail-in ballot application materials (including their ballot if they've already received it) and request the cancellation of a mail-in ballot in-person <u>up to Election</u> <u>Day</u>
 - Before Early Voting Begins: at the early voting clerk's office
 - During Voting: at their polling location after speaking with the Presiding Election Judge

A VOTER WHO IS CANCELING THEIR MAIL-IN BALLOT APPLICATION <u>MUST RETURN ALL MAIL-IN BALLOT APPLICATION MATERIALS</u> (INCLUDING THEIR BALLOT IF THEY HAVE ALREADY RECEIVED IT) AT THE TIME OF CANCELLATION

If a voter fails to return all of their mail-in ballot at the time of cancellation, they will have to cast a Provisional ballot.

After a mail-in ballot application is canceled, the voter may vote a regular ballot in person during Early Voting or on Election Day
